

Covid-19 Vaccinations Underway

Child vaccinations (ages 5-11) have begun:

COVID-19

Vaccination tickets (*sesshu ken*) were sent out to children aged 5-11 in February, and child vaccinations began taking place at children's clinics, etc. throughout the city in March. Children turning 5 from April onwards will receive their vaccination tickets in the first 10 days of the month after their birth month. Please see the Shizuoka City Covid-19 Vaccination Reservation Website for information about child vaccinations (ages 5-11), or scan this QR Code for an English leaflet:





You can get your booster (3rd) vaccination 6 months after your 2nd vaccination. Booster vaccination tickets (*sesshu ken*) will be sent out in order of 2nd vaccination date. You can make a reservation as soon as your ticket arrives. Please note that you cannot receive a booster vaccination until 6 months have passed since your 2nd vaccination.

1st and 2nd vaccinations still available:

Those wishing to receive their 1st or 2nd vaccinations should consult the City website or the Covid-19 Vaccination Call Center (above).



Advice from the City of Shizuoka:

We recommend making a reservation as soon you receive your ticket. All of the vaccines we use have been proven to be effective, regardless of maker.

Changes at City Hall from April

In response to the changing social landscape, City Hall will undergo the following restructuring.

1. Ensuring the Safety and Peace-of-Mind of Residents Strengthening frameworks relating to Covid-19

countermeasures:

To further promote Covid-19 countermeasures, and maintain a comprehensive framework for monitoring infection rates, administering vaccinations, etc. we will be establishing a "Covid-19 Countermeasures Division" within the Health, Hygiene & Medical Care Department. This division will take over the management of the "Covid-19 Countermeasures Center" currently being run through the Health, Hygiene & Medical Care Division. A "Vaccination Policy Center", will also be established, allocating the necessary extra staff.

Strengthening support frameworks for children and their families as well as for new and expectant mothers

A "Children and Family Comprehensive Support Hub" will be established within the Childcare Support Division of each Ward Office, combining the fields of welfare and mother-child health to provide counseling and support with regards to raising children. We will allocate the necessary extra staff to make this possible.

City Budget: How Much Is Spent on Me?

The city budget per resident for FY2022 is: ¥490,699. This is calculated by taking the total general account budget amount (¥337.8 billion) and dividing it by the number of city residents as at Jan 2022 (688,406 people).

To further strengthen safety control frameworks at disaster sites, we will be restructuring the "Disaster Response Support & Unit Control Center" in the Operations & Services Division and establishing a "Safety Policy Division" in the Emergency Operations Department.

2. Maintaining Frameworks Ahead of the 4th General Plan Maintaining frameworks related to "Woodland Culture Community Development"

In order to consider and implement specific policies for the formulation of sustainable upland communities, a "City of Woodland Culture Policy Promotion Office" in the Upland Promotion Division.

Maintaining frameworks related to "Greenness & Carbon Neutrality" In order to promote a wide range of policies for the realization of a green society, a "Green Policy Promotion Office" will be established in the Environmental Policy Division.

April is "Prevention of Under-20 Drinking Awareness Month"

Persons under the age of 20 are legally prohibited from consuming alcohol. In addition, parents are legally required to prevent their children from drinking, and restaurants and shops are legally prohibited from selling or serving alcohol to underage customers.

The Age Restriction for Drinking Will Not Change:

The age of majority in civil law will be lowered to 18 in April. However, the age restriction for drinking alcohol will remain at 20.



5 Reasons Why Under-20s Shouldn't Drink

- 1. It lowers brain function.
- 2. There is a higher likelihood of causing damage to your liver and other organs.
- 3. There is a risk of causing abnormalities in the release of sex hormones..
