4th Shots of Covid-19 Vaccine Have Begun

Vaccination Categories	Those eligible	Details		
1 st , 2 nd and 3 rd shots	Persons 12 years old and up	See the City Website, the Vaccination Reservation Site, or call the Covid-19 Vaccination Call Center		
4 th shots	①Persons 60 years old and up ②Persons 18-59 years old with underlying conditions, etc.	Persons in ① and ② are said to be more likely to develo severe Covid-19 symptoms. As such they are eligible for 4th shot of the vaccine once 5 months have passed since their 3rd shot. As the City does not have information of everyone's underlying conditions, vaccination tickets are being sent out to all residents over the age of 18 in order of when you received your 3rd shot. Please check whether you are eligible for a 4th shot.		

*Please do not lose your vaccination tickets as they are necessary to receive vaccinations. Details regarding vaccinations and reservation instructions are included in the envelope with your vaccination tickets.

*The covid-19 vaccine is effective at protecting against Covid-19 infection and the onset of severe symptoms. However, this effectiveness is said to slowly decrease with time. Additional shots of the vaccine are reported to restore this lost effectiveness. Please make sure you have accurate information and consider being vaccinated.

*This information is accurate as at 6 June 2022.

Regarding 1st and 2nd Child (5-11 years old) Vaccinations

Child vaccinations are being carried out at medical facilities such as pediatric clinics. Children who have recently turned 5 will receive their vaccination tickets in the beginning of the month after their birth month. Please talk with your family and regular physician and consider vaccinating your children. See the City website for more information on vaccination schedules, etc.




Advice from the City:

We recommend making a reservation as soon as you receive your ticket. Analysis done within the city makes it clear that vaccination is effective at preventing Covid-19 infection, as well as the development of severe symptoms.

Please keep up Covid-19 countermeasures during the summer heat. In summer we often close the windows and turn on the air-con, but please remember to ventilate the spaces you inhabit to prevent the spread of the virus. There has been a rise in Covid-19 cases with children who aren't able to be vaccinated yet. Let's protect our children from Covid-19.

Applications Open for National Pension Fee Exemptions

Applications for the July 2022 to June 2023 National Pension Insurance Fee General Exemption System will open on 1 July (Fri). (You can apply for exemption for past fees up to 2 years and 1 month before the date of application.) The National Pension Insurance Fee for this fiscal year is ¥16, 590 per month.

What is the National Pension Insurance Fee General Exemption System?

This is a system **granting exemptions or postponements** to those who find it financially difficult to pay their National Pension Insurance Fees. After application, the annual income for the previous year of the applicant, their spouse, and the head of household (applicant and spouse in the case of postponement) is assessed by the Japan Pension Service. Leaving fees unpaid may result in you not being able to receive various pension benefits, so please apply to this system if you are having difficulty paying.

Regarding Pre-and-Post-Childbirth Exemption System

This is a system in which Type 1 enrollees in the national pension plan can apply for exemption from paying insurance fees in the period before and after giving birth. Persons who gave birth on 1 February 2019 or later are candidates, and applications can be submitted from up to 6 months before the baby's due date.

National Health Insurance Cards Are Changing from Violet to Light Green

New National Health Insurance Cards for each household, to be used from 1 August, will be sent to the head of household starting from the middle of July (even if the head of household isn't enrolled in National Health Insurance). Once you receive your new card, please check if the details on it are accurate. If there are any mistakes, please submit a notification to the Insurance & Pension Division of your ward office.

Caution is advised to the following persons:

Persons who will turn 70 by next year July

The health insurance card we will be sending is valid until the end of the month in which you turn 70 (or the month before, if you turn 70 on the first day of the month). Before the health insurance card expires, a "combined health insurance and elderly recipient card" (被保険者証兼高齢受給者証/hihokensha sho ken kourei jukyusha sho) will be sent to your head of household, bearing the co-payment ratio.

Persons who will turn 75 by next year July.

The "combined health insurance and elderly recipient card" we will be sending is valid until the day you turn 75. We will send you your Medical Care System for the Elderly Aged 75 or Over Card (後期高齢者医療被保険者証/ koki koreisha iryo hihokensha sho) before your 75th birthday.

Persons who have applied for delivery by registered mail.

If there is no one to sign for the health insurance card when it is delivered, you will receive a notice saying that it is being kept at the post office. Please contact the post office to have it redelivered.

Traffic Accidents in Shizuoka City (Jan-Dec 2021)

Accidents resulting in injury or death: 3,507

Injuries: 4,213 Deaths:19

Accidents involving the elderly: 1,324

Although the number of accidents involving the elderly is decreasing, they make up an increasingly large proportion of total traffic accidents. The proportion for 2021 was 37.8%, the highest in 10 years.

Accidents involving bicycles: 831

Although the number of accidents involving bicycles is decreasing, they made up 23.7% of total traffic accidents in the city in 2021. Compare this with 15.5% for the prefecture as a whole and you can see that the level is still high. The number of **accidents involving electric bicycles** has been increasing since 2020.

Periods in which many accidents occur:

08:00-09:00 (592); 16:00-17:00(530)

Many accidents occur during rush hour, when people are commuting to and from work and school, and in the evening.

Let's use electric bicycles safely

When you start pedaling: Switching on electric assist while your foot is on the pedal may cause the bike to jump forward. Please be careful when activating the electric motor.

When stopped: Leaving your foot on the pedal when stopped may cause the electric motor to activate and the bike to jump forward. Please keep your brakes on when stopped and avoid carelessly resting your foot on the pedal.

When getting off: Jumping off the bike without braking may cause you to lose your balance and fall. Please use your brakes to come to a complete stop before dismounting.

We will be opening the 1st floor of the Shizuoka City Museum of History to the public in advance of the official opening next January. The excavated remains of a late-Sengoku-era road and stone wall will be on display. This 30m by 2.7m road, believed to be from the time Tokugawa leyasu lived in Shizuoka (late 1500s), can be viewed unaltered and up-close.
