Afterschool Kids' Club

The "Afterschool Kids Club" (hokago jido kurabu) is an initiative that looks after elementary school children whose parents aren't at home after school due to work, etc., and nurtures them in a safe and wholesome environment.

October is Food Waste Reduction Month!

Food loss refers to "still edible food that gets thrown away". In October of 2019, the Act on Promoting Food Loss Reduction was enacted, creating Food Loss Reduction Month (October) and Day (October 30th). In addition, the UN has designated October 16th as World Food Day, a day to think about food-related issues. In Japan, food waste amounts to over 5.2 million metric tons a year*. Over 2.4 million metric tons* of this waste comes from homes. One of the ways to reduce food waste from homes is food drives.

*Food loss estimate for 2020 Fiscal Year (Ministry of Agriculture, Forestry and Fisheries)

What's a Food Drive?

This is an initiative whereby excess food from homes in collected in collection boxes and donated to "food banks"*. Food banks are organizations that distribute these unconsumed but still edible foodstuffs to people and facilities in need, free of charge. Collection boxes are in place at ward offices and a variety of other points around the city. Collection also takes place at events, etc.

Food that can be donated:

- Products with an expiration date of Jan 2023 or later.
- Unopened products that can be stored at room temperature.
- Grains (excluding mochi rice); canned food; instant foods, foods in a retort pouch; snacks; dried goods; drinks

Food than can't be donated:

- Products with an expiration date of December 2022 or earlier.
- Frozen or refrigerated products
- Opened products;
- Fresh food/perishables; Salt and sugar; alcohol (including mirin and other cooking alcohols); nursing care/health food products; mochi rice; pet food; disaster water provisions

Food Drive Participation

The city is running a campaign to raise awareness about "food drives". Participate in a food drive and answer a survey to receive a reusable, plastic-free Eco-Cup (supply is limited; first come first served).






