

Sakura Momoko Exhibition at Shizuoka City Museum of Art



Sakura Momoko (1965-2018), born in Shimizu Ward (the former Shimizu City) and known for creating the nationally popular manga, “Chibi Maruko”, also excelled as an essayist, lyricist, and screenwriter. In addition to original drawings from works such as “Chibi Maruko”, “COJI-COJI”, and Momoko’s 1984 debut manga, “Oshiete Yarunda Arigataku Omoe!”, this exhibition contains the handwritten manuscript from her best-selling essay “Momo no Kanzume” and about 300 related original drawings and personal artifacts that have never been exhibited before.

Sakura Momoko delighted in both drawing and writing. She adored the changing of the seasons and the minutiae of everyday life. This exhibit delivers the magic of Momoko’s world in all its glory, leaving nothing out.
